Transportation in Bucharest and Ilfov county

Ilfov County surrounds Bucharest, the capital of Romania. Located in the south of the country, Ilfov County lays on 8225 km square. Bucharest and Ilfov County are the main entrance gate by air in Romania. Two airports are serving the capital: Henry Coanda and Baneasa.

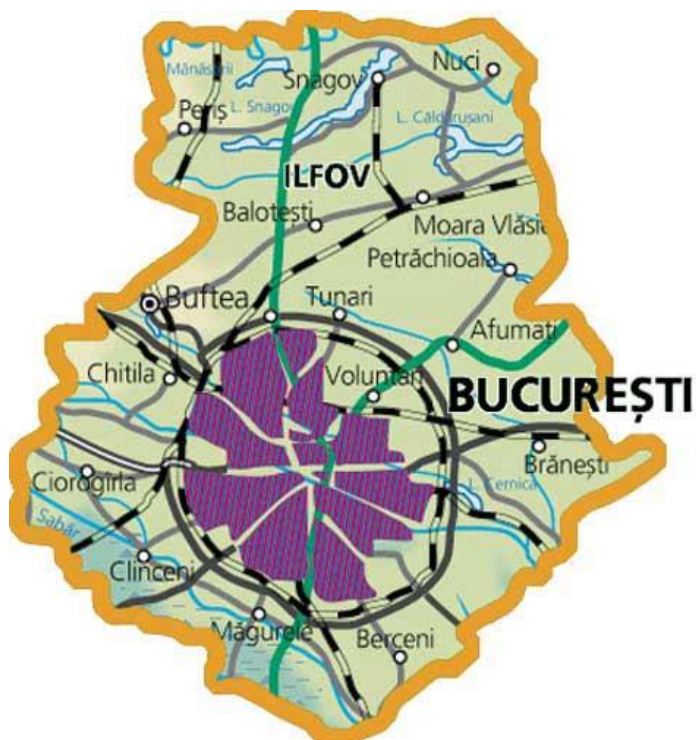


Bucharest is the most important start point for railroads leading to several destinations in Romania or Europe. North Station is the main station. Built between 1868-1872 the station hosts now the Railroads Museum and the Royal hall recently restored in the original shape.

Basarab, Progresul, Baneasa, Titan and Obor are other stations in Bucharest.



By this reason Ilfov County is crossed by many roads and railroads.



Seven national roads starts from Bucharest crossing the county, three highways and main railroads passing through several stations as Peris, Buftea, Chitila, Mogosoia, Balotesti, Pasarea, Pantelimon or Branesti.



Domnesti village is crossed by two railroads.
